




TECHNOLOGY/INNOVATIONS

- Used of different climate change resilient strains of Tilapia through cross breeding process adaptable to different climate condition able to produce high and good quality fingerlings.
- Establishment of two (2) Brood Ponds with 1.5m water depth that can be used as breeding site of tilapia during tropical months.
- Application of organic fertilizer (CM) to enhance the production of natural foods in the pond.
- For continuous source of food for the breeders, brood ponds were supplied with "green water" taken from his grow-out ponds that consists of rich in protein planktons and moina which serve as the natural food for the breeders.

- Spearheaded the development of protein-rich Open Pollinated Variety (OPV) as food and feed addressing malnutrition for human and livestock
- Instrumental to the development of improved Adlay milling machine to address post harvest problem of Adlay growers
- O Initiated the development of white and purple corn food products such as Cracknic, Cage Bagga, Mangi Pansi and Cornbi. Likewise, he innovatively spearheaded the development of corn waste (silk) into healthy diuretic juice product called "Maize Silky Sip"

The harmonious relationship established by the organization with the barangay led them the successful attainment of the various 4H project.


- Existing vegetable project expanded to livestock production project where officials of the Barangay donated twenty (20) heads of chicks and one (1) piglet to the organization as initial stock.
