The Provincial Health Office together with the Commission on Population in the Region celebrates the 3rd birthday of JC de Mesa Zipagan, Isabela's 100Mth Symbolic Baby from Masipi East, Cabagan, Isabela.

The purpose of this activity is to conduct an annual monitoring on the health, nutrition and oral health status of the baby and the family as well. In celebration, the Provincial Government provides planting materials and chicks to augment the family's source of food supply. The Provincial Health Office also provided medicines and dental kits, donated food packs and clothing. The Commission on Population in the Region awards gift packs worth Php5, 000 to the symbolic baby and family.

Last July 11, 2017, in celebration of the World Population Day 2017 with the theme, Family Planning: "Empowering people, Developing Nations" or "Pagpaplano ng Pamilya Lakas ng Sambayanan, Kaunlaran ng Pamayanan", the municipality of Roxas was the seat of the simultaneous celebration for this year.

It was graced nonetheless by the very supportive Local Chief Executive of Roxas Mayor Jonathan Totep Calderon, Vice Mayor and the Regional Population Officer in partnership with the MHO and IPHO. A total of 30 young parents were provided with FP information on modern family planning methods and lecture on informed choice and volunteerism (ICV). It aims to achieve the following: to assess the status of implementation of FP service provision focusing on setting up FP services, recording and reporting of FP performance, in-reach demand generation and service utilization; to identify gaps and remaining challenges in the continuing implementation of FP services and lastly to address the identified gaps and remaining challenges by enhancing the existing policies and updating/formulating the FP work and financial plan.

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ACCELERATING THE REDUCTION OF UNMET NEED IN THE DISTRICT HOSPITALS AND RURAL HEALTH UNITS

Date: March 14 & 15, June 30, 2017

Family planning is a health intervention in preventing unintended pregnancies and for improving maternal and child health and well-being. In urban areas where there are large inequities in family planning use, particularly among the urban poor, programs are needed to increase access to and use of contraception among those most in need. LuzonHealth, a development partner committed in improving MNCHN Programs, together with the IPHO FP coordinator scheduled field visits to some provincially maintained hospitals like the GFNDY, Milagros Albano District Hospital, Tumauini community Hospital, Manuel A. Roxas hospital and RHUs in Cabagan, Tumauini and Roxas in Isabela on March 14 & 15,2017 and June 30, 2017 respectively.

The demand generation activities in FP unmet need for modern family planning aims to foster dialogue about family planning; increase social approval for family planning services, improve knowledge and perceptions of family planning methods and generate report on FP unmet need for modern family planning.

The Annual Operational Plan (AOP) is a local policy instrument that allows the LGUs to state local investment preferences and priority interventions for a particular year based on strategic and medium term proposals enumerated in the Local Investment Plan for Health (LIPH).

This is best summarized through the prescribed matrix, which generally includes all the details on work, scope, targets, budget requirements, and monitoring arrangements for the proposed interventions for any given year. It is a yearly interpretation of plans espoused from the LIPH which shall be institutionalized as the localization tool of national health programs, as the mechanism for local health investment planning, and as the official means for the DOH and development partners to engage LGUs. It shall also be used to leverage better performance, reduce performance disparity, and increase LGU Funding for Health.

The AOP aims to define the directions for the consolidated 2018 Annual Plan for Health from different municipalities, cities and provincially maintained hospitals with emphasis on Philippine Health Agenda (PHA) 12 legacies of DOH for 2017-2022.
