
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#### FAST RUN for FP Workshop

#### **Physicians as Catalysts of Family Planning Program**

Our development partner LuzonHealth has developed an eLearning course entitled "Basic Family Planning eLearning Course for Physicians", as part of its technical assistance in Family Planning Program. The newly designed course was introduced in the province of Isabela last August 15, 2017 during an orientation meeting which was attended by representatives from the Isabela Provincial Health Office (PHO), Provincial DOH office, Department of Health Regional Office (DOHRO) II and Southern Isabela General Hospital (SIGH). During the meeting, the IPHO was identified to play a critical role in its implementation, particularly in the pre-selection of participants among various health service providers in Isabela, evaluation of the participants' course entry plan and monitoring of reproductive health-related activities.

As a follow- on activity, since the course was conducted among 16 out of 20 participants who were able to attend it on October 4, 2017 along with the SIGH training team, each participant is expected to submit an action plan which will be reviewed and approved by the Isabela IPHO. This action plan is one of the requirements in passing the course and which will serve as checklist during the Post-Training Evaluation (PTE) scheduled on December.


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#### "Kapit-kamay para sa Kaligtasan ni Nanay at Beybi"

#### "BE ON THE ROAD TO HALL OF FAME!"

The Department of Health today recognized Local Government Units, Government Offices and Hospitals implementing 100% tobacco-free environment through the **DOH RED ORCHID AWARD** held at Fort Ilocandia Resort, Laoag City on November 9, 2017.

The **RED ORCHID AWARDS** is the first of its kind in the world, in giving out recognition to cities, municipalities, government offices and health facilities that are strictly enforcing tobacco control measures.

For the Province of Isabela, the winners were chosen on the strength of their comprehensive efforts to implement a 100% Tobacco-free environment following the World Health Organization's "MPOWER" initiative. MPOWER is an acronym that denotes the six proven tobacco control policies namely

- Monitor Tobacco use and prevention policies
- Protect people from Tobacco smoke
- Offer help to quit tobacco use
- Warn against the danger of tobacco
- Enforce bans on tobacco advertising
- Raise taxes on tobacco

Among those awarded were; Municipalities of Echague, Jones, San Mariano, San Mateo, Ramon and Cauayan City for the LGU category garnering a score of 91-100% for the Red Orchid Awardee and Cordon as Pink Orchid Awardee with a score of 90% below . For the Government Offices category, the Isabela Provincial Health Office also bagged the award garnering a score of 91-100%, 2<sup>nd</sup> timer and now a candidate for the category of **Hall of Famer** for 2018 including the Municipalities of Echague, Jones and San Mateo.

#### **Community Action for Enhanced Maternal & Newborn Care**

The shift to Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR) from Maternal Death Review placed a greater emphasis on *Response*. The Provincial Review Team are now required to submit a report to the National Safe Motherhood Program of the Department of Health, on the details of the case reviewed and to include status of the Response implementation.

MDSR goes beyond reviewing the circumstances surrounding the death but more importantly it reviews all deaths' causes and what the LGU/government's interventions and responses were, as well as monitoring to determine effectiveness of interventions.

With this trend, a special orientation was called last November 9, 2017 at the Piazza Zicarelli Hotel and Restaurant, Upi, Gamu, Isabela attended by Municipal Health Officers and Chief of hospitals together with the provincial MDSR team. The purposes of the activity are:

- To discuss the overview of Maternal Death Surveillance and Responses (MDSR) and its objective is to have a full appreciation of the Maternal reporting and review protocol.
- To understand reasons of the shift from Maternal Death Review to MDSR as well as its process

MDSR is reviewing the roadway that lead to the death of a woman/newborn which includes investigation of the incidents in the community, from prenatal to postnatal and activities that might have led to the unfortunate event.

Non-communicable diseases or NCDS are by far, the leading cause of death in the world, representing 63% of all annual deaths. In the province, based on the 2016 Vital Health Indices, NCD tops in the Ten Leading causes of Mortality ( Cardiovascular disease ) and no. 2 in the Top ten leading causes of Morbidity (Hypertension).

To motivate individuals and groups of this fact, and prevent living a sedentary lifestyle that increases their risk for Non-communicable diseases as well as increase their knowledge and interests in physical activity and exercise, the Department of Health – Region II in coordination with the IPHO, launched the Provincial Hataw Exercise last November 8, 2017 held at the Amphitheater, Provincial Capitol, Ilagan, Isabela.

The activity was attended by 200 healthy lifestyle advocates from the cities and municipalities of Isabela.

The Department of Health- Regional Office 2 strives to continue its effort to lower the incidence of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and promote Healthy Lifestyle in support to the Pilipinas **Go 4 Health Movement**, which entails the four (4) strategies (GoSigla, Go Sustansiya, Go Smoke-Free and Go Slow Sa Tagay) for the prevention and control of NCDs.
