## BASIC FAMILY PLANNING ELEARNING COURSE FOR PHYSICIANS

Date: October 4, 2017

Venue: Southern Isabela General Hospital Cafeteria, Santiago City

Our development partner LuzonHealth has developed an eLearning course entitled "Basic Family Planning eLearning Course for Physicians", as part of its technical assistance in Family Planning Program. The newly designed course was introduced in the province of Isabela last August 15, 2017 during an orientation meeting which was attended by representatives from the Isabela Provincial Health Office (PHO), Provincial DOH office, Department of Health Regional Office (DOHRO) II and Southern Isabela General Hospital (SIGH). During the meeting, the IPHO was identified to play a critical role in its implementation, particularly in the pre-selection of participants among various health service providers in Isabela, evaluation of the participants' course entry plan and monitoring of reproductive health-related activities.

As a follow- on activity, the eLearning Course was conducted among 20 participants (15 MHOs and 5 Resident doctors from the provincially maintained district hospitals) along with the SIGH training team who are:

- Interested in including FP in their professional practice
- Involved in FP program implementation whether as clinician or program manager
- Skillful in basic computer functions
- Able to use a computer or mobile device with a good internet connection.

#### **Mental Health & Psychosocial Support Training**

Date: October 16-20, 2017 Venue: Nassim Hotel, Sta. Ana, Cagayan

As a way to celebrate Mental Health Month, the Department of Health organized an intervention among health workers and its partner agencies to promote a sound mental health that will especially during disasters and calamities. As a result of these adversities, casualties, damage to properties and displacement of some population groups usually occur. It is observed that response activities were focused on provision of basic material needs and interventions are limited to address mental health and psychosocial concerns of displaced families.

This activity came into fruition last October 16-20, 2017 with the active participation of health workers and other frontline line responders mainly to avoid possible incidence of mental health issues such as depression, grief, anxiety and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) facilitated by expert Psychosocial Team from DOH-Region 3 headed by a psychiatrist together with nurses and social workers. Salient topics include an overview of the Mental Health & Psychosocial Support (MHPPS) as a program in the over-all disaster response was clearly presented along with members to include the NDCC,DOH,DSWD,DepEd and PNRC and that WASH,Nutrition and Psychosocial Services as an independent and one of the 8 clusters based on NDCC Memorandum 12 Series of 2008 and its 5 core strategies. Aside from the series of lectures, Structure-Learning Exercises(SLE) such as role-plays and interactive games were conducted to develop openness, trust and mutual respect essential to the provision of psychosocial support. Aside from such ethical principles, confidentiality is also greatly emphasized during the training.

The province of Isabela participants namely, Dr. Marichu S. Manlongat, Rural Health Physician; Gina G. Rivero,RSW and Rhodora D. Santos, Administrative Officer joined by other health workers from different provinces in the hospitals and provincial offices surely had a productive experience listening to the concepts discussed that definitely enriched their skills in providing better psychosocial services.

#### TRAINING ON DIABETES MELLITUS MANAGEMENT USING INSULIN

Date: October 10-13, 2017 Venue: Hotel Carmelita, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan



The Department of Health Regional Office II (DOH-RO II) conducted a training on Diabetes Mellitus Management using insulin for the Municipal Health Officers and Nurses of different municipalitites of Isabela held at Holtel Carmelita, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan last October 10-13,2017 with the Integrated Provincial Health Office (IPHO) staff as co-facilitators. The objectives of the training include to advocate support from the decision-makers, co-workers, and other stakeholders, diagnose Diabetes Mellitus and Educate/Counsel patients on diabetes diagnosis and its complications, to capacitate the participants using insulin for diabetes management and to gain knowledge and develop skills for a smooth conduct of the roll out trainings for local government units.

Diabetes is one of the largest global non-communicable health emergencies of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. World Health Organization estimates that globally high blood glucose is the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest risk factor for premature mortality, after high blood pressure and tobacco use. Over the several decades more and more people live with this condition and 46.5% of them are unaware, which can result in life-changing complications. In addition to the 415 million adults who are estimated to currently have diabetes which is estimated to reach 642 million adults by 2040, there are 318 million adults with impaired glucose tolerance, which puts them at high risk of developing the disease in the future. In 2015, the United Nations Member States adopted the Sustainable Development Goals which included targets on non-communicable diseases: "By 2030, reduce premature mortality from non-communicable diseases by one-third". In the province of Isabela, non-communicable diseases are the leading causes of mortality and morbidity, hence aggressive efforts are implemented to help lessen its incidence thru proper management.

The forum showcases the result of Epidemiology Bureau's epidemiology surveillance report (ESR) and DPCB's maternal death reviews conducted by various Provincial and City Review Team with support from the Regional Offices in 2016.

Moreover, the conference provides a venue to disseminate information, the concept of Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR). Foster the commitment of every stakeholders for the implementation of the *Response*. Solutions were planned to overcome the identified issues and gaps of the distinguished priority area by knowing what are the **barriers** and **drivers**, any actions that promote change towards hindering or achieving the objective. Thus, improving the quality of care accorded to mothers and newborns..


