Multiple emerging health issues have begun to affect the Province of Isabela. As a result, members of the Provincial Local Health Board Committee and development partners convened to discuss these issues during the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Provincial Local Health Board Meeting.

Among the salient features included Isabela as one of the Advance Implementation Sites for the Universal Healthcare Act wherein Dr. Katrina Peca-at of the CV CHD presented a proposal for a Health Care Provider Network through the Fourmula 1 Plus Health Strategy. Others were Measles Outbreak Response Immunization among 6-59 months old children and protocols for the National Immunization Program covering the upcoming Japanese Encephalitis this May, incidence of Dengue Fever in the province. In the end, support and active involvement of all were evident as plans and programs in the next months were laid down.

As they say, "Cohesive working together for a common ground is the hallmark of a good and responsive governance"! Surely, health status of Isabelenos shall continue to be nurtured and flourished to pave the way towards improving their quality of lives!

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## **"Japanese Encephalitis: The New Public Health Enemy"** Date: March 22, 2019 Venue: Piazza Zicarelli Hotel & Restaurant

The introduction of a new vaccine in the health system entails a promising development to ensure optimal well-being among young children. A good communication plan for such a program is critical from the national level down to the regional and local levels.

In the light of such endeavor, an *Orientation on Japanese Encephalitis (JE) Vaccine* was conducted last March 22, 2019 at the Piazza Zicarelli Hotel & Restaurant, graced by government officials, healthcare workers, and many of the province's public and private stakeholders.

JE is a mosquito borne disease and a leading cause of viral encephalitis in Asia and the Western Pacific Region. Most infections are asymptomatic. However, severe disease is estimated to occur in about 1 per 250 cases; this is characterized by rapid onset of high-grade fever, headache, neck stiffness, disorientation, coma, seizures and spastic paralysis. Patients who die usually suffered from aspiration syndromes, seizures, raised intracranial pressure and hypoglycemia. There is no specific antiviral treatment or cure for JE. Supportive clinical care is important as it alleviates symptoms and stabilizes the patient.

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### "Bakuna sa Tigdas, Mga Bata'y Maililigtas" Date: March 19-20, 2019 MEASLES OUTBREAK RESPONSE IMMUNIZATION

A measles outbreak is currently storming the Philippines, and our beloved province is no exception. To curb the ongoing transmission and reduce incidence of measles, an *Outbreak Response Immunization (ORI)* was conducted in the affected municipalities of the province. All children aged 6 months – 5 years regardless of their vaccination status are given one dose of measles vaccine, through home visitations. To ensure that no child is left unprotected, the team conducting the Outbreak Response Immunization continues to make rounds in the following municipalities: Cordon, Ramon, CHO2 Cauayan City, Jones, San Agustin, Echague and San Isidro.
