“Handog Pagmamahal para sa Isabeleños”

Benito Soliven, Isabela - As a continuous run-through, the Isabela Provincial Government led by Gov. Bojie Dy brought the *Farmer’s Congress* in the town of Benito Soliven last May 16, 2014. On the health sector, the *Farmer’s Congress* aims to provide better health programs and services to Isabeleños. Under the indefatigable leadership of Dr. Rosa Rita B. Mariano, Provincial Health Officer II, utmost efforts from the Provincial Health Office-Field Health Services, RHU and San Mariano Community Hospital generated more health care services. As it is in the peak of summer, boys ages 8-11 gathered up for circumcision, a yearly practice for these little men, to “Man Up”.

The program was graced by the presence of Hon. Ana Cristina Go, Congresswoman of District II and Hon. Faustino “Don-Don” Dy IV, Sangguniang Panlalawigan. Also doctors, dentists, nurses and midwives from Provincial Health Office-Field Health Services and other district hospitals were present. The Medical – Dental Mission served **896** medical cases, **216** dental clients and accomplished **74** circumcisions.

“Monitoring and Evaluation of Local Level Plan Implementation (MELLPI) – Initial Round” May 13 & 16, 2014

Iligan City - The Isabela Provincial Government through its Provincial Evaluation Team (PET) in coordination with the National Nutrition Council (NNC) holds its annual **Monitoring and Evaluation of Local Level Plan Implementation (MELLPI)** in the different municipalities/cities in the province that have shown excellence in nutrition program implementation in their respective municipalities scheduled on May 13 to June 06, 2014.

MELLPI is a monitoring and evaluation system established by the NNC in 1979 which aims to assess the efficiency and effectiveness of local and nutrition-related activities implemented at the local level. It aims to measure changes in the nutritional status of children, determine the extent to which nutrition is integrated into local development plans and programs, and advocate for the continuing support for local nutrition programs.

Likewise, in conjunction with the MELLPI, the PET also evaluates the performance of the **Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS)**. The BNSs are the barangay-based volunteers tasked to coordinate the delivery of basic nutrition and related services in their respective area of assignments. Both the MELLPI and BNS evaluation are institutionalized activities since 1979 of the national and local nutrition committees.

The cities of Ilagan and Cauayan were the first areas that were monitored and evaluated by the Provincial Evaluation Team last May 13 (Ilagan) and May 16 (Cauayan) respectively, in preparation for the regional evaluation that will be conducted on the second week of June 2014.

“Joint Action Planning Workshop”

May 14, 2014

Highlander Hotel, Solano, Nueva Vizcaya - Last May 14, 2014, a Joint Action Planning Workshop was conducted and attended at the Highlander Hotel, Solano, Nueva Vizcaya by the PHO-NTP Core team of Isabela headed by Dr. Rosa Rita B. Mariano, 5 Municipal Health Officers, 12PHN's, 1RHM and the Diocese of Ilagan represented by Ms. Luk in partnership with the DOH Reg. 2 and the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines EPISCOPAL COMMISSION ON HEALTH CARE (CBCP-ECHC) represented by their Executive Secretary-Director in the person of Fr. Dan Vincent Cancino, Jr. MI, it was funded by the IMPACT project through PBSP.

The objectives of this meeting were the following:

- Discuss the objectives and mechanics of the partnerships between the PHO, LGUs and the Diocese of Isabela for local TB program implementation
- Prepare joint action plans and targets for the specific RHUs and counterpart Parishes in particular municipalities
- Establish the coordination and referral mechanism.

IMPACT Project objective is to contribute to the improvement of CDR and CR in Isabela for all forms of TB including MDR TB, the Strategy to achieved this objective is to strengthen participation of Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and local groups to help in Advocacy, Communication and Social Mobilization. Indeed, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines Episcopal Commission on Health Care (CBCP-ECHC) responded positively to IMPACT invitation and expressed its commitment of support to the strategy. CBCP-ECHC and the Diocese of Ilagan commit to assist LGUs/RHUs in finding TB cases and help in ensuring successful treatment of TB patients with the participation of the Diocese of Ilagan parish coordinators and volunteers. IMPACT and CBCP agreed to provide technical assistance to strengthen the partnership between the PHO, LGUs and the Diocese.

Fr. Dan Vincent Cancino Jr. MI, the Executive Secretary-Director CBCP-ECHC presented to the group one of their mission which is committing themselves to promote and assist in the establishment of Pastoral Health Care Commissions in the dioceses and parishes. A Eucharistic Mass was celebrated by Fr. Dan Vincent right after the closing program.
