PSO personnel continue to support the various programs and activities of the Office, true to it's mandate of providing training and community awareness programs , facilitate coordinating meetings and produce updated Safety IEC materials by constantly researching new safe-

ty measures and acquiring skills and knowledge thru various trainings related to Safety and Health programs.

The Office, tasked to monitor and facilitate implementation of various Road Safety Laws across the Province thru the PNP-PDRRC Quick Response Motorcycle Riders also known as the EO 18 Riders, continue to monitor operations, provide necessary reports and spread Road Safety Awareness by distributing Road Safety tips, Road Safety Program Laws and Ordinances Handbook to LEO's and flyers through various platforms such as the Farmers Congress Reloaded and Social Media.

For the month, the Office joined Road Safety activities, Local Public

Transport Planning Initial and second meeting together with the PGI Technical Working Group and heads of the PSO, PEO and PPDO offices of the Province and provided support for various National and Provincial initiatives such as the Federalism Road Show and the President's visit to the Province.

PSO Personnel attended the 2nd Session of LTFRB, DOTr and DILG's Capability Building on Local Public Transport Route Planning course held at Japi Hotel and Convention Center, Cauayan City, Isabela last September 3-7, 2018 together with personnel from the Provincial Planning and Development Office as well as the Provincial Engineering Office.

LTFRB, DOTr, DILG : CAPABILITY BUILDING AND LOCAL PUBLIC TRANSPORT ROUTE PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT COURSE SESSION 2

As part of the group composed of personnel from the Office of the Provincial Engineer, Provincial Planning and Development Office and Public Safety Office Technical Working Group sent to attend the LPTRP training course, PSO personnel Manuel Cesar G. Binag IV and Francis David G. Gangan proceeded to attend the second session of the LPTRP and Management Course training last September 3-7, 2018 held at Japi Hotel and Convention center, Cauayan City, Isabela. Counterpart City and Municipal LGU personnel across the Province also attended said event initiated by the LTFRB, DILG and DOST.

A review of past lectures regarding local transport moderni-



zation, Data Collection and Demand-Supply analysis were discussed by lecturers Architect Konstantine Koh and Engr. Aileen Mappala. Days 1-3 was mostly classroom training involving a review of the various programs and initiatives from the LTFRB and LPTRP document preparation using Local Transportation data from the LGU themselves for route planning and franchising as well as integration of several CLUP data to show population, facility and infrastructure usage, school and house utilization and zoning. Participants

were sent to various sites within Cauayan City to observe and utilize the updated and simplified survey forms given by Architect Koh. The 4th to last day of training involved data gathering, writeshop and preparation of the draft LPTRP document and practical application of the topics discussed. A final preparation period of 6 months starting from September 10, 2018 was given for the Province to collate and consolidate all LPTRP plans and routing documents for submission to LTFRB.

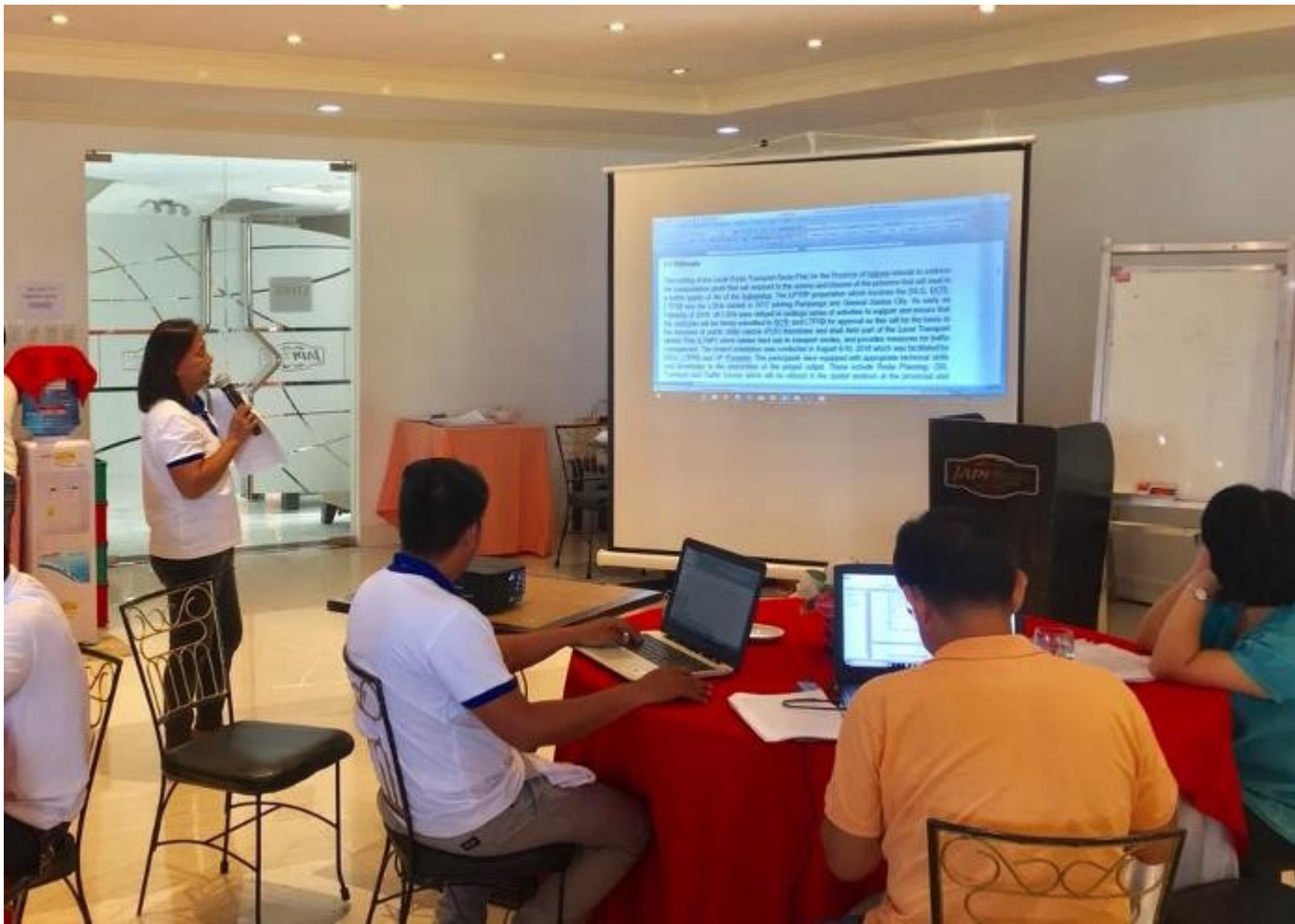
All in all, we, the PSO and PGI personnel Technical Working Group who attended the training learned a lot and understood the principle of Local Transport Planning and Route Management.
