## **Accomplishment Report for 2014**

#### A. Services:

The Women & Children Protection Center (WCPC) has served 49 cases of children in Need of Special Protection (CNSP) and Women in Especially Difficult Circumstances (WEDC) from January to December 2014. There are thirty six (36) new admission and thirteen retained cases for previous years. These are the victims of different forms of abuses. Rape is the most numbered of cases followed by incest, victims of human trafficking, WEDC and neglected. There are two (2) cases of adoption. One (1) is already cleared for inter-country adoption legal documents are still on process.

Among forty nine (49) residents served, thirty two (32) were discharged and successfully integrated to their family and community, some are referred to DOJ while two (2) of them were referred at different centers. The office conducted (35) case conferences with our counterpart PNP, local DSWD, Dep Ed., Brgy. Officials, and families/relatives of the victim to ensure best interest of the child. There are 12 cases of abuse violation of RA 8353 and RA 7610 is now on trial. The social worker assisted them to follow-up of cases, prepared supporting documents for their board of claims, escorted them in court hearings, and coordinated prosecutors who are handling the case.

The WCPC maintained and sustained the minimum standard for residential based facility. Preparation of Social Case Study Report as center heart of case management has been religiously complied reviewed and updated (98) ninety eight Social Case Study Report. Complied the required number of psychological evaluation test base on admission and prepared 49 treatment plan for period of 6 months to (1) one year.

Further, part and parcel, in the completion of level (2) accreditation such as social workers undergone 56 hours for formal training, compliance to Batas Pambansa 344 s. 1995, installed rail, ramp, toilet and bath for PWDs, accessible alarm facility, Glass doors of 6 rooms, closure of baking room (screened door), conducted yearly disaster preparedness training, installed CCTV camera and purchased of pipe-in music all are to be installed.

Enhancement of Manual of operation, crafted child protection policy, inclusion of the commitment of staff to abide with child protection policy and protection of staff and residents from sexual harassment and other forms of abuses are all included in the manual of operation.

The WCPC continues to provide temporary shelter and protective services to children needing special protection and women in especially difficult circumstances.

Programs Implemented to 49 residents are as follows:

- 1. Provision of basic needs food and clothing
  - ➤ 49 residents availed 3 sets of clothing and 1 set of beddings (annual allocation)
  - ➤ 49 residents with annual food allowance of 21,600 per child
- 2. Provision of Psycho social services
  - > 9 residents undergone psychological test
  - ➤ 49 residents undergoing counseling, stress debriefing, therapeutic activities conducted by psychologist.
- 3. Education Services
  - ➤ 12 residents undergoing modular classes
  - ► 5 resident undergone / availed ALS exams
  - > 7 resident undergoing Day Care services
- 4. Provision of medical needs
  - > 35 resident availed dental service at IPHO
  - > 3 residents hospitalized/confined at IPHO for several times
  - ➤ 27 residents undergone check-up and medication of residents (colds, cough, skin diseases, otitis media, fever)
- 5. Assisted 12 residents in court hearing
  - Facilitated/ assisted 37 residents for processing legal documents/benefits Board of claims, court resolution, follow up warrant of arrest and other legal matters
- 6. Spiritual enrichment and value inculcation
  - ➤ Coordinated JIA congregation, group of order of Franciscan secular for Bible study and fellowship (every Wednesday)
  - ➤ Reciting / Meditating daily rosary and Mass celebration every 15<sup>th</sup> of the month officiated by Bishop Joseph Nacua and company (for the month of Nov. Dec. 2014)
- 7. Provision of recreational activity
  - ➤ Celebrated Halloween Party
  - > Swimming of residents in Sta. Victoria Sanctuary Ilagan City
  - ➤ Simple celebration of their birthdays and other important occasions
- 8. Facilitated Two (2) ADOPTION CASES.
  - > Declaration of abandonment
  - > Declaration of child available for adoption
  - > Preparation of child adoption papers is on-going.
- 9. Provision of livelihood and skills training
  - ➤ 16 residents trained is cosmetology and hair rebonding
  - > Baking and beads making is on-going activity

10. Provision of transportation allowances to discharge resident and medical assistance to sick residents amounting to P69,500.00. Sources of fund are the following: P23,000.00 DSWD counterpart, P40,000.00 AICs program under PSWD and P6,500.00 LGUs counterpart.
