PVET OFFICE CONDUCTS MASS VACCINATION OF DOGS AGAINST RABIES

Alarmed by the very high incidence of rabies cases in 2013 wherein 13 Isabeleños have lost their lives, Atty. Noel Manuel R. Lopez, Provincial Administrator, ordered the Staff of the Provincial Veterinary Office (PVET Office) to conduct vaccination of ALL dogs in the barangays with positive rabies cases in order to control the spread of the disease.

Rabies is a highly fatal disease predominantly affecting warm-blooded animals such as dogs and cats including man. It is a disease of the nervous system with clinical signs of mania and paralysis and later on death. Transmission is usually through bites of rabid animals.

As early as January, the PVET Staff have started the campaign against rabies. They conducted mass vaccination of dogs in the barangays considered as priority areas for rabies control because of history of rabies in the area.
