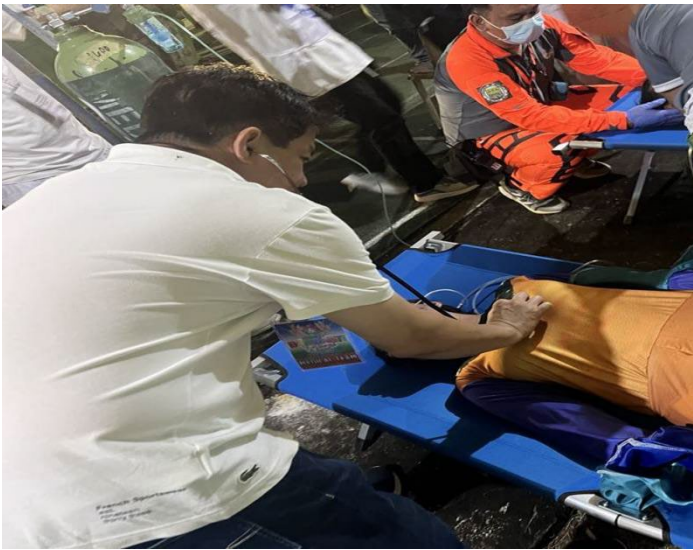
HOSPITAL ACTIVITIES:
